Allison Agwu, MD, ScM, FAAP, FIDSA, is Associate Professor of Adult and Pediatric Infectious Diseases at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, US. Her clinical and research interest focuses on youth and young adults with HIV (YHIV) with an overarching goal to optimize outcomes for youth by deciphering health disparities and optimal strategies to both manage and treat HIV infection. She is the Program Director of the Pediatric/Adolescent HIV/AIDS Program. She is also the founder and Medical Director of the Accessing Care Early Clinic, a youth-focused adult clinic. These health resources and services administration-funded programmes have been integral to the transition of YHIV from paediatric to adult care. Dr Agwu has worked independently and with large national and international research groups spearheading the paediatric and adolescent agenda. She is the principal investigator of the Johns Hopkins sites

of the International Maternal Pediatric and Adolescent AIDS Clinical Trials' Group (IMPAACT) and the Adolescent Trials Network. She is a member of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Adolescent and Adult Antiretroviral Treatment Guidelines and the HIV Medicine Association Board of Directors.
