## Sheri A Lippman, United States

Sheri A Lippman, an Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco, is an epidemiologist with more than 15 years of experience conducting research focused on identifying social and structural factors that impact HIV prevention and treatment and developing interventions to modify contexts that place populations at risk. Dr Lippman's portfolio of research includes three National Institutes of Health (NIH) grants to explore the conceptual development of community mobilization processes through the conduct of community-randomized trials focused on modifying the social environment for young people and adults in South Africa. Dr Lippman's research also includes interventions addressing social barriers to care for HIV-positive populations, specifically peer-support interventions to increase care engagement, including leading two NIH grants and a Health Resources and

Services Administration-sponsored cluster randomized trial. The third grant is for Dr Lippman's research exploring HIV self-testing among key populations, including research in South Africa, Latin America, and the US. Dr Lippman has more than 60 indexed publications.
